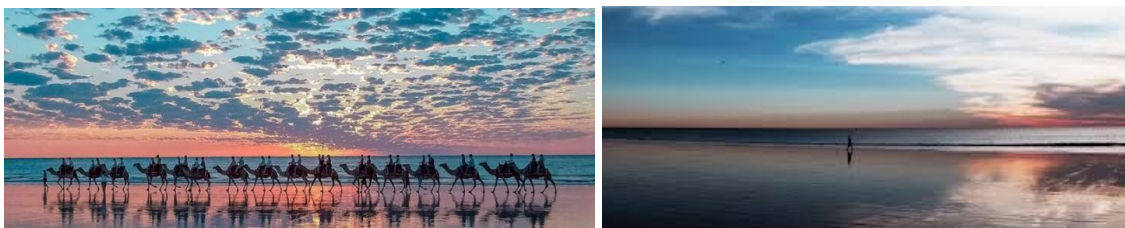
Introduction to Broome:

Take time to visit [Nagula Jarndu](#), a studio showcasing hand crafted textiles by Aboriginal women and take home an original piece of art and [Hidden Valley Handcrafts](#) to purchase a unique natural skin care product, candle or soap. [Gallery Sobrane](#) has an amazing collection of original art well worth a visit. The famous Courthouse markets are on every Saturday to see all the local arts and crafts, food stalls and you can also book local tours.

Visit [Willie Creek](#) for a Pearl Farm tour or just browse the Pearl boutiques in town to take home a special Pearl souvenir and a lasting memory of your trip.

If sitting by the pool or too many massages ([Bali Hai Spa](#) have an extensive collection of natural treatments to choose from) just gets too much then plan an adventure day up in a plane to the Kimberley falls or out on a charter boat to enjoy the stunning scenery - book through [King Leopold Air](#); [Horizontal Falls Seaplanes Adventures](#) and [Absolute Ocean Charters](#) for an experience you will never forget.
